Introduction:

In 2013, New York State established the Human Trafficking Intervention Courts (HTICs) – special courts that adjudicate prostitution related cases



Incidences of human trafficking in the New York State region (2019) ¹

Goals of the HTICS:

- 1. Combat human trafficking in New York State, which is most often in the form of sex trafficking ²
- 2. Interrupt cycle of arrest, release, and exploitation for victims
 - Sentence is up to 3 months and/or up to \$500³
 - Common for victims to return to their abusers⁴



How do the HTICs work? 5


- 1. HTICs receive prostitution case
- 2. Judges and lawyers evaluate the case
- 3. Identified victims are given resources such as job-training or drug treatment
- 4. Victims who accept services may have charges dropped

Victims are treated like criminals:

- Identified only after being arrested
- Many held in prison and mistreated ⁶
- Court proceedings can be traumatic and embarrassing⁷
- Some sentenced to prison 8



Lilly: A Success Story? 10



Explained that her former pimp put her in debt, forcing her to return to sex work

Court understood, gave her more counseling and possibility of dismissal

Lilly is still vulnerable to exploitation and likely to return to sex work. The court does not continue to protect her
