Word has also been received that there will be an additional meeting of the Society at Claremont in conjunction with the Pacific Coast Division of the American Philological Association in November. Papers will be by Paul Friedländer and Thomas G. Rosenmeyer, under the chairmanship of Harry Carroll.
