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AN INVESTIGATION OF "JUST TALKING": ASSIGNING AN OPERATIONAL DEFINITION TO A CONTEMPORARY DATING PHENOMENON

BACKGROUND

College students increasingly use the phrase "Just Talking" to describe interactions with potential romantic and sexual partners.

This project explores the meaning and purpose of "just talking"

STUDY DESIGN

Study 1: We coded qualitative survey responses from college students describing their understanding of "Just Talking"

Findings indicated that "just talking" is an ambiguous relationship phase defined by lack of labels, commitment, and exclusivity.

Study 2: To further investigate this, we began conducting same and mixed-gender focus groups and analyzed conversations for common themes and discrepancies.

Preliminary findings indicate that most "talking" occurs over either Snapchat or other messaging apps, and that its definition and purpose are unclear



Focus Group Quotes


In terms of talking, that's just like such an open term that can lead to so much interpretation... Some people take that as being exclusive, some people take that as we're still hooking up with other people. That leads to problems when no one ever clarifies like what is this. [...] Especially if like different genders have different goals.

Such a gray area Kinda just like an excuse to not commit

This is ridiculous like we literally use these terms as an excuse to just shy away from actually committing to someone and like being involved in a relationship

I feel like girls are definitely more likely to say that talking is something that might lead to a relationship especially college girls but *college guys in particular* I feel probably *think* of it as something that doesn't require commitment and doesn't necessarily have to lead to commitment. It could definitely be more of a physical thing with guys rather than an emotional

I feel like women have a more emotional aspect to their relationships than men do



WHY SAY YOU'RE "JUST TALKING" TO SOMEONE?

DISCUSSION STUDY 1 SURVEY RESULTS, FALL 2020

Some people have described their interactions with others with the phrase "we're just talking". What does the phrase "just talking" mean in this context?

After almost 230 responses, our data showed that there is still no consensus

Responses ranged from: committed relationship to a **non-committal** relationship, a physical relationship to a non-physical relationship, and many stated it was a pre-dating period

Responses ranged from defining the purpose of "just talking" based on traits such as the presence or lack of commitment, how casual the interaction was, or if it involved sexual encounters.

The general consensus surrounding this data supports the lack of a definitive purpose when it comes to "just talking."

STUDY 2 FOCUS GROUP, SPRING 2021

Preliminary analysis of an all-female focus group revealed that women think men use this phase to avoid commitment, and are less inclined to view "just talking" as a means to get into a relationship

In the first round of focus group data collection, we found that "Just Talking" is:

Purposefully vague Used to avoid commitment **Initiated based on physical attraction**

However, previous data suggests that women are more likely to use this phase to avoid commitment, and men are more likely to describe "just talking" as a pre-dating phase.
