# The joint session begins.



# **Legal Parameters**

- U.S. Constitution's First Amendment: A protest must be peaceful, on warranted grounds, & can constitute suggestions
- specifically with the intent to impede government processes
- 18 U.S.C. § 2385: Illegal to distribute information about, rally support for, or contend the necessity to unlawfully overthrow the government

## White supremacy


#### The Institutions:

 Many of the rioters did not expect consequences from their actions and many stated they believed the police would be receptive to their presence at the Capitol

To officers: "You gotta let us by...You don't have to listen to them...tell your guys...We're on the same team. You don't have to take these orders." -**Arrested Rioter George** Purdy



## **Historical Continuity**

- The entitlement portrayed by rioters mimicked those of race mobs in the 19th-20th century
  - Many broadcasted and shared their crimes



- Whenever there is racial progress or reform expectations for a presidential election, there is a following riot.
  - In 1861 at slavery abolitionist Abraham Lincoln's certification, a mob stormed the Capitol
- President Joe Biden was the candidate supporting the demands from 2020 Black Lives Matter
