Research Limitations

Hours per Case

Case type

- We were unable to obtain concrete evidence of the success of our proposed solutions due to their inherently subjective nature
- Our identification system for limitations on public defense is intentionally vague to account for the vast amount of factors that impact the success of public defense
- Our research into specific components of public defense was hindered due to the short time frame in which we worked

Legal Framework

"The right of one charged with crime to counsel may not be deemed fundamental and essential to fair trials in some countries, but it is in ours."

- Justice Hugo Black, Gideon v. Wainwright (1963).
- → County Law 18-b created a county-based public defender system in New York State following the *Gideon* decision
- → Executive Law Article 30 § 832(3f) provides state funding for public defender offices
- → Strickland v. Washington (1984) established a two-pronged test to determine effective assistance of counsel

Rectifiable Issues Funding, staffing Rectifiable Issues External Rectifiable Issues Persistent Issues Local (housing), law Access to programs

Conclusions

- The simultaneous use of triage and holistic defense has the potential to strengthen the public defense system as a whole
 - Triage: parole hearings
