Importance and Focus:

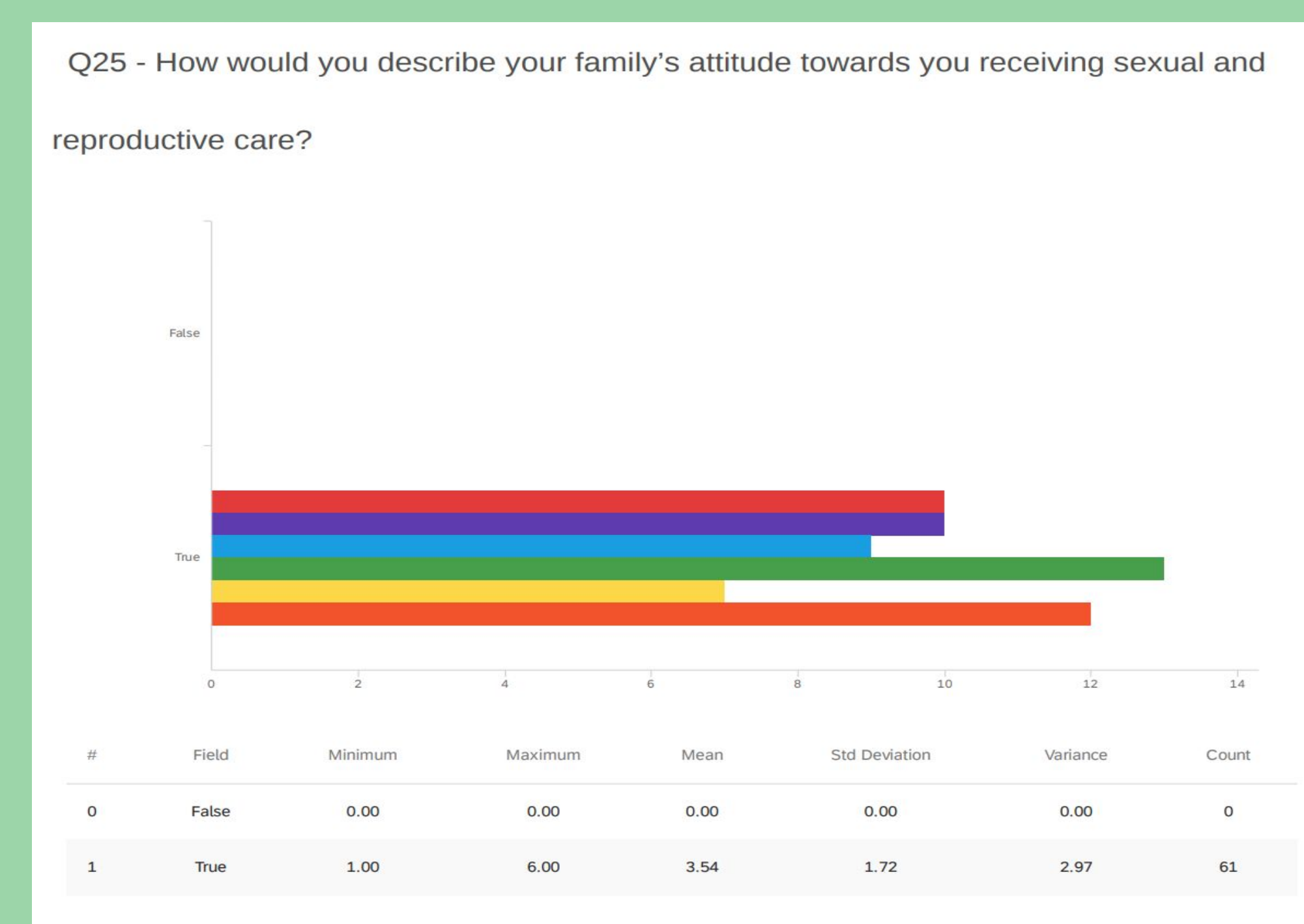
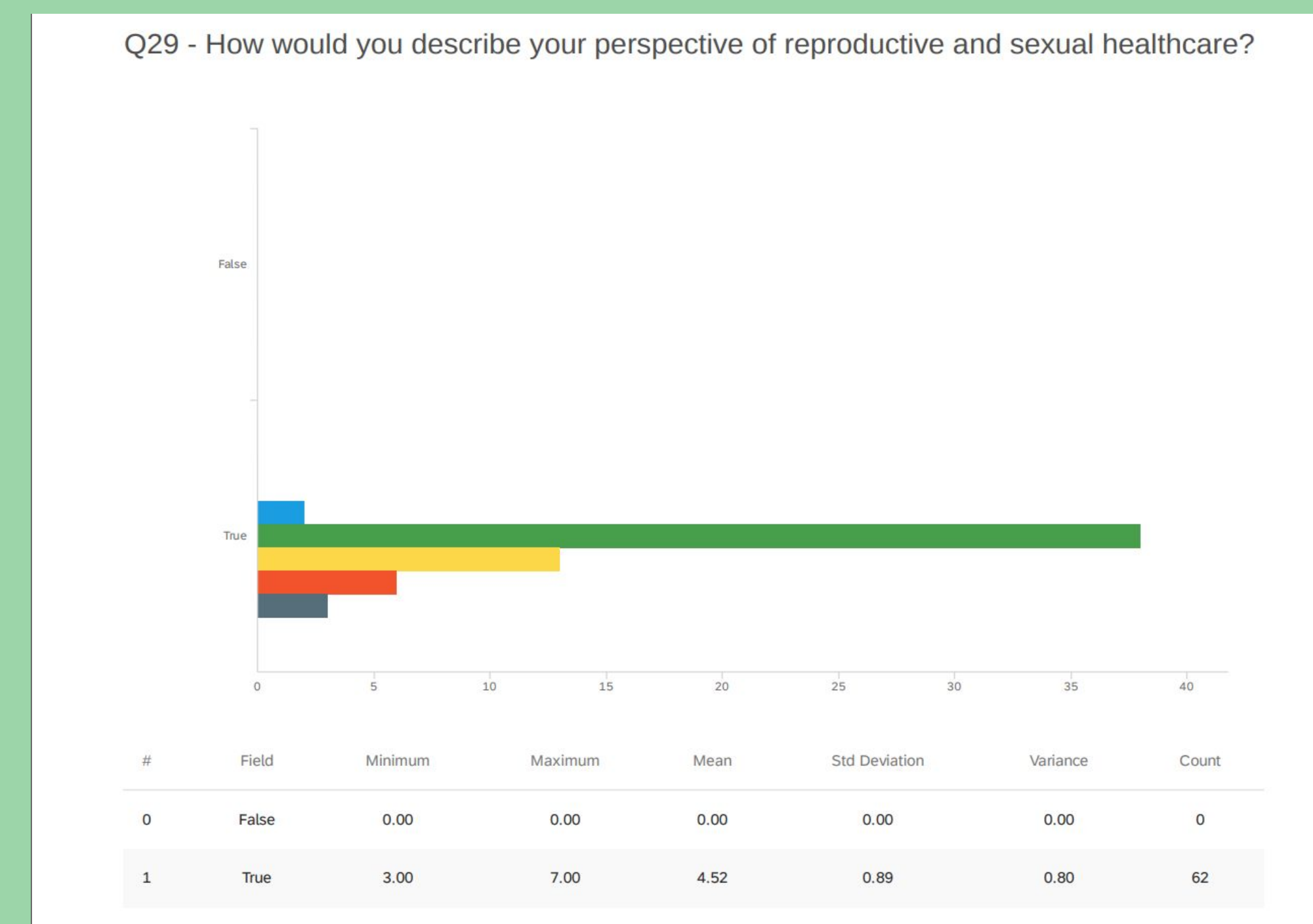
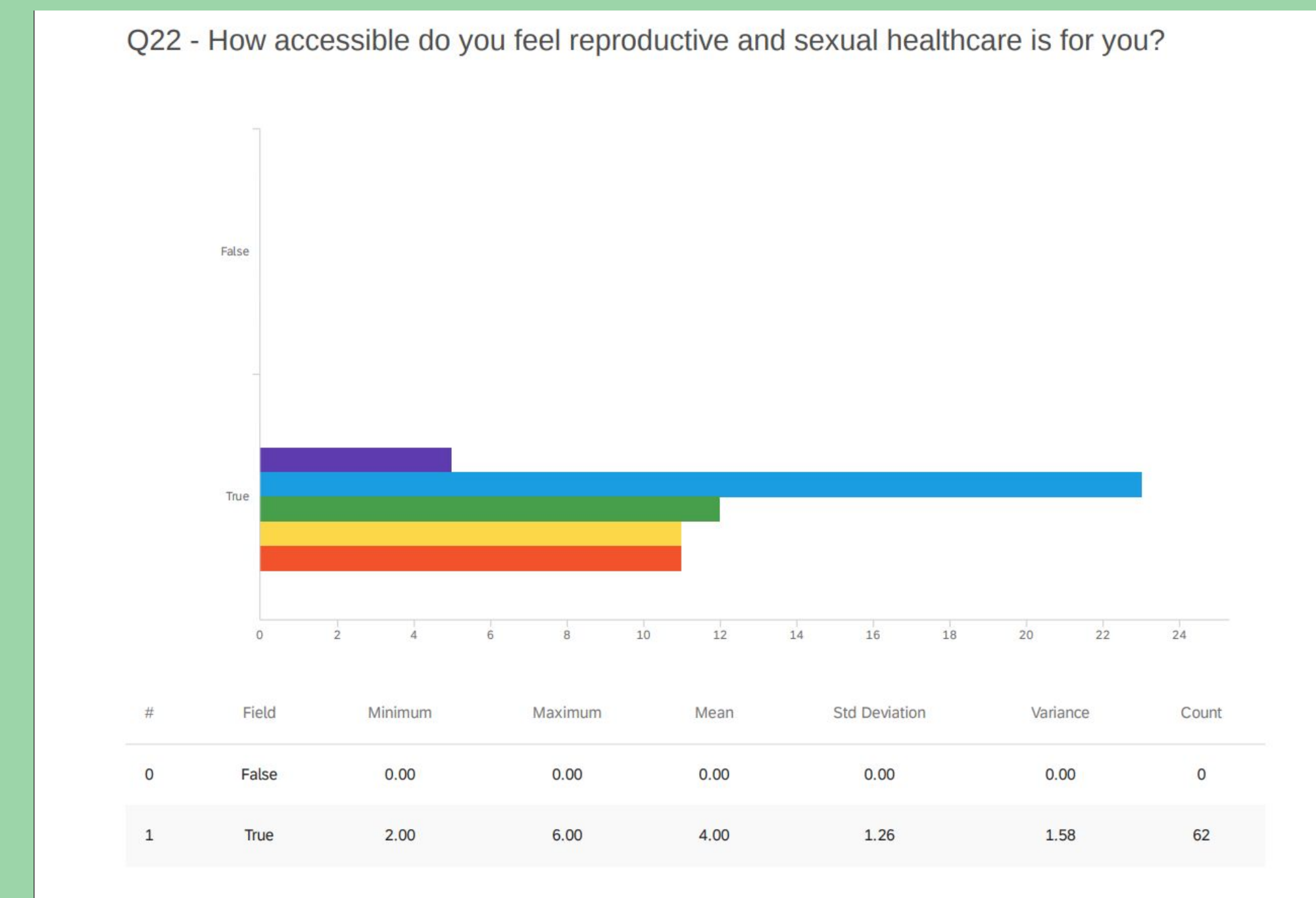

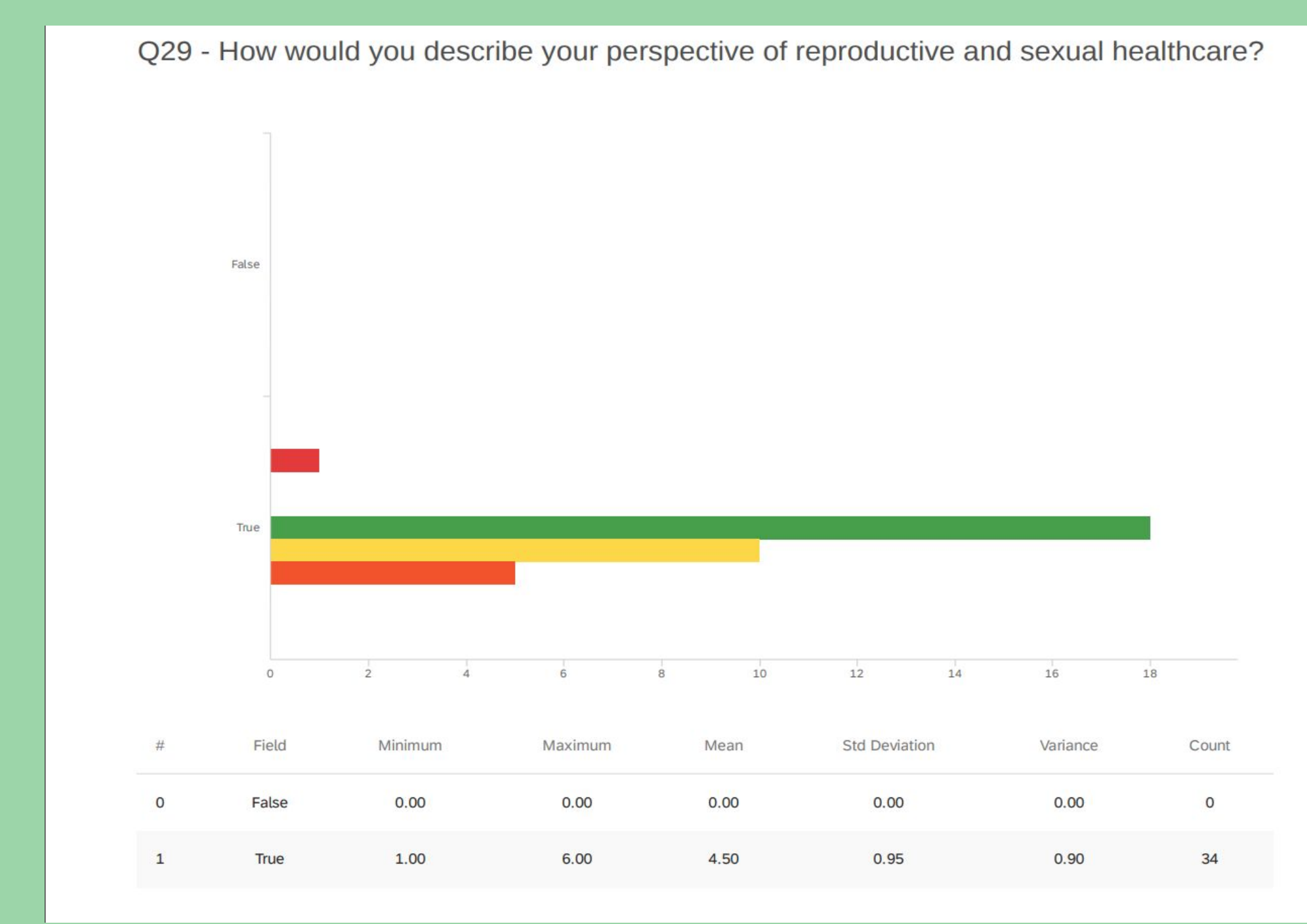
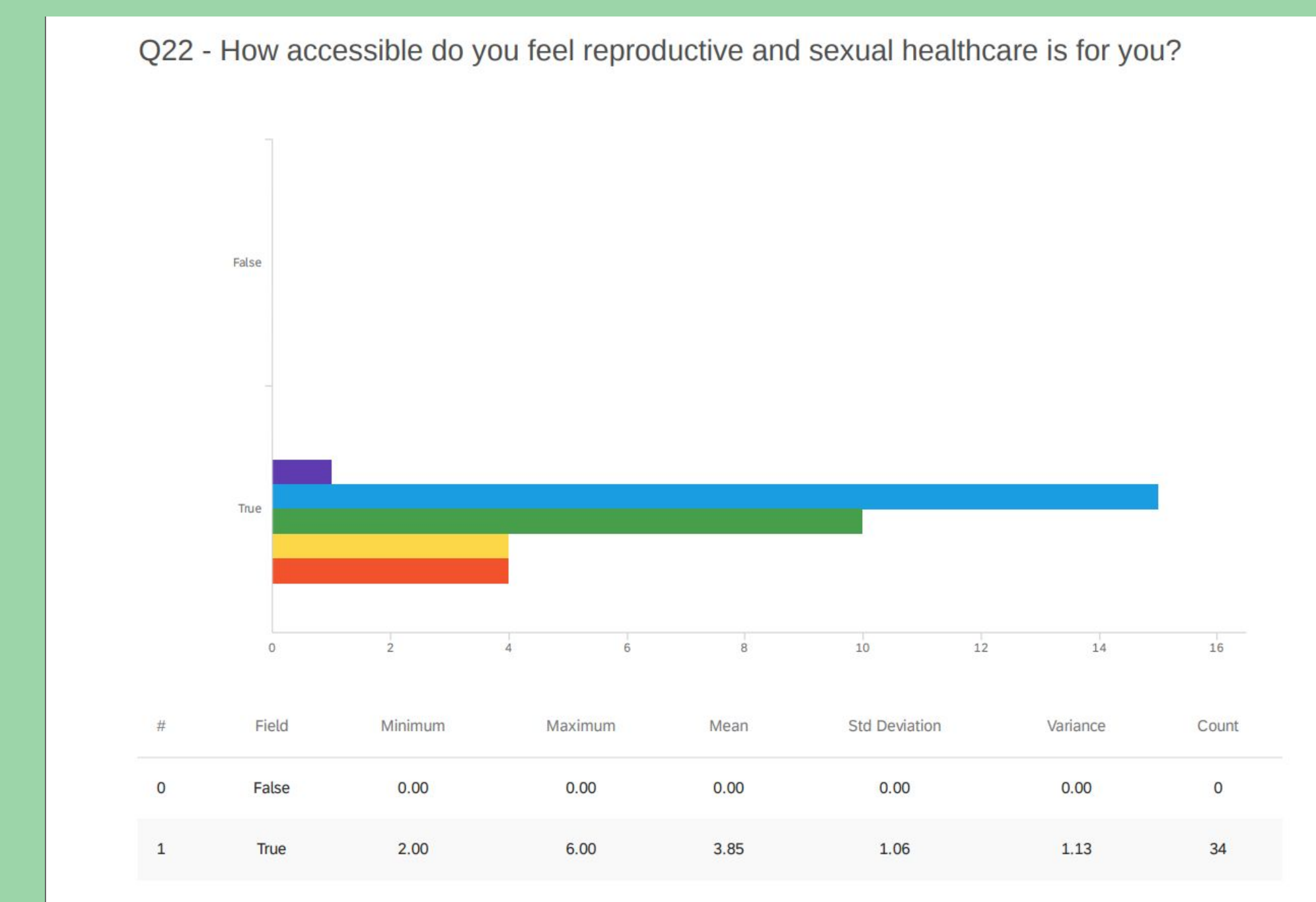
1. Reviewed and created summaries of various peer-reviewed articles

Non-marginalized populations



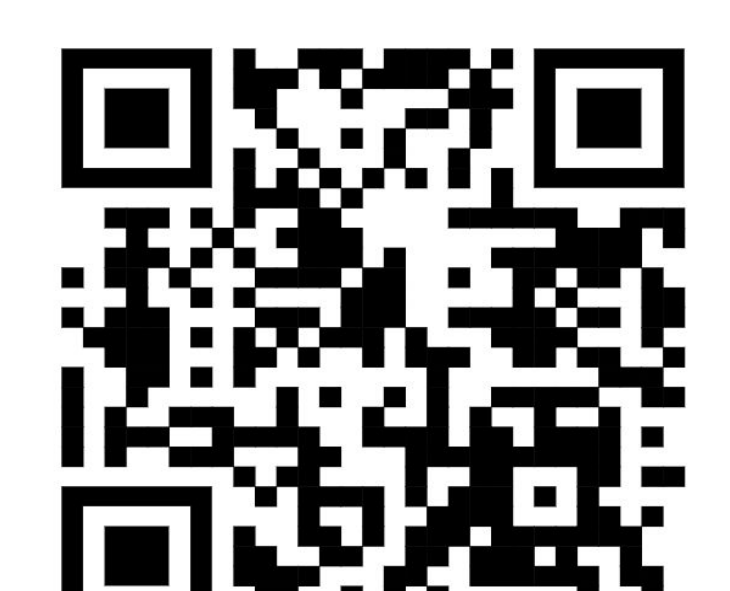
Discussion and Conclusion:

As my survey is still ongoing, I do not have a definite conclusion but so far the results have shown that different populations have different perceptions of reproductive and sexual health care accessibility and are surrounded by different family viewpoints. Surprisingly, a more negative family viewpoint corresponded with a more positive perception of accessibility when comparing both groups. Based on this data it can also be inferred that that quality of care does not impact accessibility as it was relatively similar in both groups whereas perception of accessibility differed.
