Why Alternative Vocabularies?

LCSH doesn't always get it right.

Occasionally, terms in LCSH just won't be the right fit for the resource we're cataloging.

LCSH does their best to keep their vocabulary updated and inclusive but sometimes terms are outdated or inappropriate.









Some reasons LCSH lags behind

- 1. Terms are based on literary warrant
- 2. They are the Library for the Congress of the United States
- 3. Long administrative processes

Per the Project for Cooperative Cataloging (PCC), catalogers should feel empowered to integrate alternative vocabularies as needed.



There are a *lot* of alternative vocabularies.

The LOC MARC office keeps an updated list <u>here</u>: https://www.loc.gov/standards/sourcelist/subject.html





My criteria for a choosing a controlled vocabulary

- 1. Authorized for use in MARC
- 2. Well maintained
- 3. Open information about how it is updated

Bonus points for linked data interoperability



A good rule to follow when selecting terminology:

use the term that the group being described uses to describe themselves.

Library of Congress Demographic Group Terms (LCDGT)

- Based on literary, user, and organizational warrant.
- Used for creator/contributor/audience characteristics (also useful for NACO cataloging)
 - Can be found at
 - LC Website (PDFs or id.loc.gov)
 - Classweb




Library of Congress Demographic Group Terms (LCDGT)

- Good for describing:
 - Indigenous people
 - (ex: Haudenosaunee (North American people))
 - occupations
 - (ex: Protein chemists)
 - with people first language
 - (ex: People with cerebral palsy)



 - Art styles (ex: Czech Cubism)
 - Art forms (ex: Face vessels)
 - Art techniques (ex: Aquarelle (technique))
 - Book terms (ex: Accordion album bindings)




Rare Books and Manuscripts Controlled Vocabulary for Rare Materials Cataloging (RBMSCV)

- Good for describing:
 - Genre terms (ex: Alphabet wheels)
 - Printing terms (ex: Anthropomorphic letters)
 - "Anti" content terms (ex: Anti-communist works)
 - Special occasion terms (ex: presentation copies)



 - Specific gender identities (ex: Demigender people)
 - Any time you want to use the term LGBTQ+
 - Fandoms (ex: Gender in fandom)





What can I do if I can't find a term?

- Look up similar resources to see what other librarians have done to help
- Enter a blurb in a 520 field so it still has keyword access
- Reach out to a SACO funnel or the editorial board of the appropriate vocabulary to help create a new heading
