INTRO


- In Political Science, "The Bargaining Model" maps costs and benefits of war to identify a bargaining range that can prevent war (see image, bottom center) (Frieden, et. al., 2020)
- Incomplete information hinders effective bargaining

METHODS

- Key Question: How does disinformation disrupt the bargaining model?
- Apply the theories and definitions of the field of Disinformation Studies to international conflict (Kuo & Marwick 2021, Wardle 2020, and others)
- Analyzed the Russian invasion of Ukraine (2022) to demonstrate how disinformation immediately disrupted the bargaining process

RESULTS


- Historical disinformation shapes modern politics
- Disinformation destroys any chance of peaceful bargaining through the guise of ideology and interests
- Ukraine is suffering from the costs of misleading information
- Disinformation may give leaders an upper hand militarily


