RESULTS


- •There is a trend of a decline of population in Binghamton after 2011 only stopping in 2020

- 20,000 Residents were evacuated overall
- Currently 42% of properties are considered at risk (PropertyShark)
- Rents rose steadily
- 299 Homes destroyed, 9,000 more damaged
